Subject: USAA members to weigh in with elected representatives

UPDATE ON OVERPAYMENTS TO DISABLED PILOTS

Overpayment of LTD benefits to disabled pilots was discussed in a recent memorandum from DDPSA. Some information contained in that memo may not be correct. This memorandum will discuss new information has come to light relating to income tax ramifications of the overpayment and repayment. As mentioned in the previous memo, you can disregard what follows if you did not receive a repayment notice or were not overpaid by the D&S Plan.

TAX RAMIFICATIONS

As a result of increases in retirement benefit payments from the PBGC, a number of disabled pilots were overpaid LTD benefits from the D&S Plan and now have to repay the amount of the overpayments. The overpayments were taxed as income in the year payment was received. The folks at Delta administering the payback indicated that the method of recovering excess tax payments from previous tax years is to file an amended tax return. **It appears that this information may be incorrect.** We must emphasize that DDPSA is not qualified to give tax advice and is not providing tax advice.

Two DDPSA members forwarded information to us that you may want to discuss with your accountants or tax advisors. The references are IRS Publication 15 (page 30) and IRS Publication 525 (page 36).

IRS Publication 15 (Page 30) is quoted below.

"Employee reporting of repayment. The wages paid in error in the prior year remain taxable to the employee for that year. This is because the employee received and had use of those funds during that year. The employee is not entitled to file an amended return (Form 1040X) to recover the income tax on these wages. Instead, the employee is entitled to a deduction (or credit in some cases) for the repaid wages on his or her income tax return for the year of repayment."

IRS Publication 525 (page 36) discusses the method of deduction or credit. DDPSA will consult with an accountant on this matter and post relevant information on the DDPSA website, www.ddpsa.org.

Hopefully, this size of the article is what you anticipated. Future short articles should focus on:

- 1. History of the D&S Plan.
- 2. Purpose of the D&S Trust.
- 3. Annual report (form 5500) of the Plan (next report should be available in early June).
- 4. Security of benefits under the D&S Plan.

Additionally, I will be providing you with an update on the bombshell of LTD overpayments, required payback and income tax ramifications. We are still sorting out the latter issue with DDPSA's accountant.

SURVIVOR BENEFITS FROM THE DELTA PILOTS DISABILITY AND SURVIVORSHIP PLAN

Even in the post-bankruptcy environment, the **Delta Pilot Disability and Survivorship Plan** (D&S Plan) provides a **benefit to eligible survivors of deceased Delta pilots (including both disabled**

and normally retired pilots) — a survivor's benefit that is distinct from and in addition to any joint life annuity benefits payable under the Delta Pilots Retirement Plan. This article will provide a brief review of survivor benefits under the D&S Plan.

Survivors eligible to receive benefits from the D & S Plan include the "Qualifying Spouse" and in addition, may include natural born or legally adopted children under the age of 19 (under age 23, if still in school.) (IMPORTANT NOTE: A "Qualifying Spouse" is a spouse who was married to the pilot while he/she was an active Delta pilot and who remains the pilot's legal spouse continuously up until the pilot's death (see the Pilot Benefits Handbook for details.)

HOW MUCH CAN A SURVIVING SPOUSE EXPECT TO RECEIVE?

If you elected a lump sum distribution from the Delta Pilots Retirement Plan, a rough approximation of the surviving spouse's benefit under the D&S Plan is the amount of annuity income that you were receiving from the Delta Retirement Plans (both Qualified and Non-Qualified) prior to Delta's bankruptcy. For pilots who retired after Sept 1, 2005, a rough estimate is one-half of the formula retirement benefit that should have been payable if the Delta Pilots Retirement Plans had not been terminated. A more accurate estimation involves calculations based upon final average earnings, years and months of Delta service, age at retirement and variable increases that have occurred since the date of your retirement. An up-to-date estimate of your survivor's benefits from the D&S Plan can be obtained by making a request through the Employee Service Center (1-800-MY-DELTA). An interactive **Benefit Worksheet** that estimates survivor's benefits is posted on the website of the **Delta Disabled Pilots and Survivors Association** (DDPSA) at www.ddpsa.org under the Survivor section.

Most retiring Delta pilots elected a "single life annuity" from the Delta Pilot Retirement Plan based on their reliance on the survivor's benefit provided by the D&S Plan. However, if you elected a joint life annuity under the Delta Pilot Retirement Plan, an additional survivor's benefit may be payable from the PBGC.

Future articles will discuss other aspects of the D&S Plan as well as the security provided by the D&S Trust.

Hi Skip:

I read your comments about the many millions of dollars going to Delta retirement funds but none to help the forgotten Retired Delta Pilots. I also read Mr. Richard Anderson's remarks about paying cash for the new B777-LR. Evidently when

you don't have to pay your Retired Delta Pilots their earned retirement, you have plenty of money left over to pay for other things.

The sad thing is most of us gave our entire working lives to Delta Airlines and we were promised our retirement form the very first day that we started working for Delta. Life was always good! Most of us had no furloughs. Delta paid our paychecks from the day we were hired until the day we retired. Most of us did not finish our 20 years in the reserves because Delta always made good on all of its promises.

To be cheated out of our retirement by the likes of Mr. Anderson, who continuously boasts about the achievement in places like the Wall Street Journal and at expensive banquets, is certainly something less than delightful for us to endure.

So why aren't we over it already and moving on? Well, we were pilots for 30-40 years and developed no additional skills because they were not required. Delta paid us well because they wanted us rested to fly our trips. Now in our late 60's and 70's and 80's we have to pursue new ways of generating enough money to survive in the worst economy since the Great Depression. There are no jobs for us old guys.

A lot of Retired Delta Pilots are hurting very badly. Many of us lost more than 80% of our September 2005 retirement checks. A financial planner friend of mine remarked, "I don't know how you plan for that!" A Bank of America Senior Loan Officer remarked when I told him about Delta's dirty deed; "They can do that?" He was shocked by the revelation.

I realize flying the line is not the job it used to be, but getting a decent paycheck every two weeks is better than trying to survive retirement on a fraction of what you planned for 40 years. Fortunately, Delta pilots can now fly until age 65 which will give them 5 more years to recover.

Let's not even talk about the secret 135 elites who looked out only for themselves when Delta's Retirement Fund looked like it was in danger. Most of these "Highly Quality Executives" left Delta in less than a year.

Lee Iacoca once asked, "Where are our leaders?" Great Leaders lead by example and strive to do the right thing; not make excuses for improper behavior. Or hide behind the law to justify inaction.

Something can be and should be done to clear up the injustices being endured by the Retired Delta Pilots. If it is done properly, the law will be followed and the Retired Delta Pilots can be justly rewarded. The Delta Family should feel a moral obligation to do the right thing!

There are always ways of doing things where everyone wins; so far the Retired Delta Pilots have received very little for what they gave and for what they were promised.

Everyone is shocked when they hear about what happened to the Retired Delta Pilots except Mr. Anderson. He seems to harbor the attitude that it was a business deal and it's over. That's the coward's way out; just ignore it and it will go away.

This is where a great leader would step up and make things right. How do you think Lee lacoca would treat the Retired Delta Pilots who built this airline, flew on all the weekends and holidays, in traitorous weather, for three and four decades, who always came to work on time and gave the airline the outstanding safety record it enjoyed? I'm sure Mr. lacoca wouldn't take away their earned retirement and tell them to apply to be Walmart Greeter in their 70's and 80's.

It's time for Mr. Anderson to be a great leader and do the right thing!
