Northwest Airlines union sues Delta

Union for former Northwest flight attendants sues Delta, claiming contract breaches

On Thursday August 26, 2010, 4:21 pm EDT

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) -- The union for Northwest Airlines flight attendants has sued Delta Air Lines Inc., saying their new managers are breaking the contract with the union.

The federal lawsuit filed in Washington claims Delta is violating rules about scheduling and other issues. For instance, the Association of Flight Attendants-CWA says its members are supposed to get more than two days off after a long international flight -- but Delta is giving them only 11 hours. The union also claimed that Delta is meeting with flight attendant groups that it chose without inviting the union, and that it is not resolving grievances brought by the union.

Justice Dept signs off on United-Continental deal

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) -- United and Continental airlines moved a big step closer to their proposed combination on Friday, with the Justice Department saying it has no more antitrust concerns about the deal.

On Friday, the two airlines said they would lease takeoff and landing slots in Newark to Southwest Airlines. The Justice Department says that clears up its main competitive concern.

Shareholders at Continental Airlines Inc. and United parent UAL Corp. are set to vote on the deal on Sept. 17. The combination would create the world's biggest airline.

- 8. Expiration of HCTC 80% premium subsidy will expire on December 31, 2010. Back to 65%.
- 9. Financial condition of the D&S Plan--a plan that pays benefits to eligible survivors of deceased pilots as well as to disabled pilots. A form 5500 for the D&S Plan is filed annually.

Dear Phyliss-

I am the vice chairman of the Delta Disabled Pilots and Survivors Association (DDPSA). Our membership includes existing survivors of deceased pilots, potential future survivors of deceased pilots and disabled pilots. Our website is www.ddpsa.org.

The only valid reasons that I can see for Delta requesting an annual update from an existing eligible survivoring spouse would be in the following instances:

- (1) If there were children eligible for surviving benefits, documentation could be required to prove that the children remained eligible (age, student status, unmarried).
- (2) If the pilot died while in a disabled status before retiring and such death occurred before the effective date of the 2000 Pilot Working Agreement, the surviving spouse could be required to verify that she had not remarried.e copied
- (3) If Delta wanted to verify that the surviving spouse was still alive.

In order for me to better understand your situation, please forward a copy of the request for verification that you received from Delta.

Here is a quote from an Ev Gost & Jim George article concerning this issue:

"Survivors eligible to receive benefits from the D & S Plan include the "Qualifying Spouse" and in addition, may include natural born or legally adopted children under the age of 19 (under age 23, if still in school.) (IMPORTANT NOTE: A "Qualifying Spouse" is a spouse who was married to the pilot while he/she was an active Delta pilot, and who remains the pilot's legal spouse continuously up until the pilot's death (see the Pilot Benefits Handbook for details.)"

Subject: Discount tickets

I think you are referring to the Fly Confirmed for Less (a 20% discount for a confirmed seat) as opposed to the Fly Confirmed for Even Less (a greater discount for active employees only at this time). Delta is working on opening this lower fare up to retirees, too, but it may be after the first of the year before it is offered.

A ZED fare is a mileage based fare for Non-Rev standby seats on *other* airlines. You can access that fare information on the TravelNet from the dropdown panel "Leisure Travel" and, then, click on "Interline Travel".

All these fares - confirmed and standby - must be purchased at a Delta Ticket Counter, not online.

Hope this answers your question.

First thanks for taking up the baton from Dave. We really appreciate your service. You may want to share with the group that on a recent domestic flight from PBI-ATL, the agent called us to the gate about 15 minutes before departure (the flight was boarding and we had already received seat assignments on the monitor and were just waiting for our zone to be called). He made us check our small rolling bags due to the full flight (just like every flight these days) due to the overhead bins being full. In fact there was room and we had deliberately traveled with hand luggage due to a tight connection in ATL and also because it is my habit to always avoid checking luggage if possible. This may become more prevelant in future although I hope not. Just a word to the wise, it may be that you will have to check a bag on future flights even if it fits in the overhead (or under your seat). In the past they have always gate checked such bags which means you get them back planeside when deplaning. I asked if this would be possible and only got a negative head shake.
